

So YOU want to Build a Library?

What do you think makes the perfect library? Well, now's your chance to show everyone!

Construct a library using everyday materials in this all-ages building competition, either in a team or on your own.

Basic building materials such as cardboard, paper, tape and glue will be provided by the library (along with some surprise objects!), but contestants may also bring in building materials from home.

Your library will be constructed in a 3-hour time period on May 26, starting at 5pm at the Millstadt Library, however you can plan your build any time before that as long as no actual construction takes place.

The libraries built will be judged on their design, appearance, and building techniques (see Judge's Rubric-attached), and the winners of each competition (team and individual) will win a trophy. Winners will also have a picture of themselves, and their creation hung inside the library.

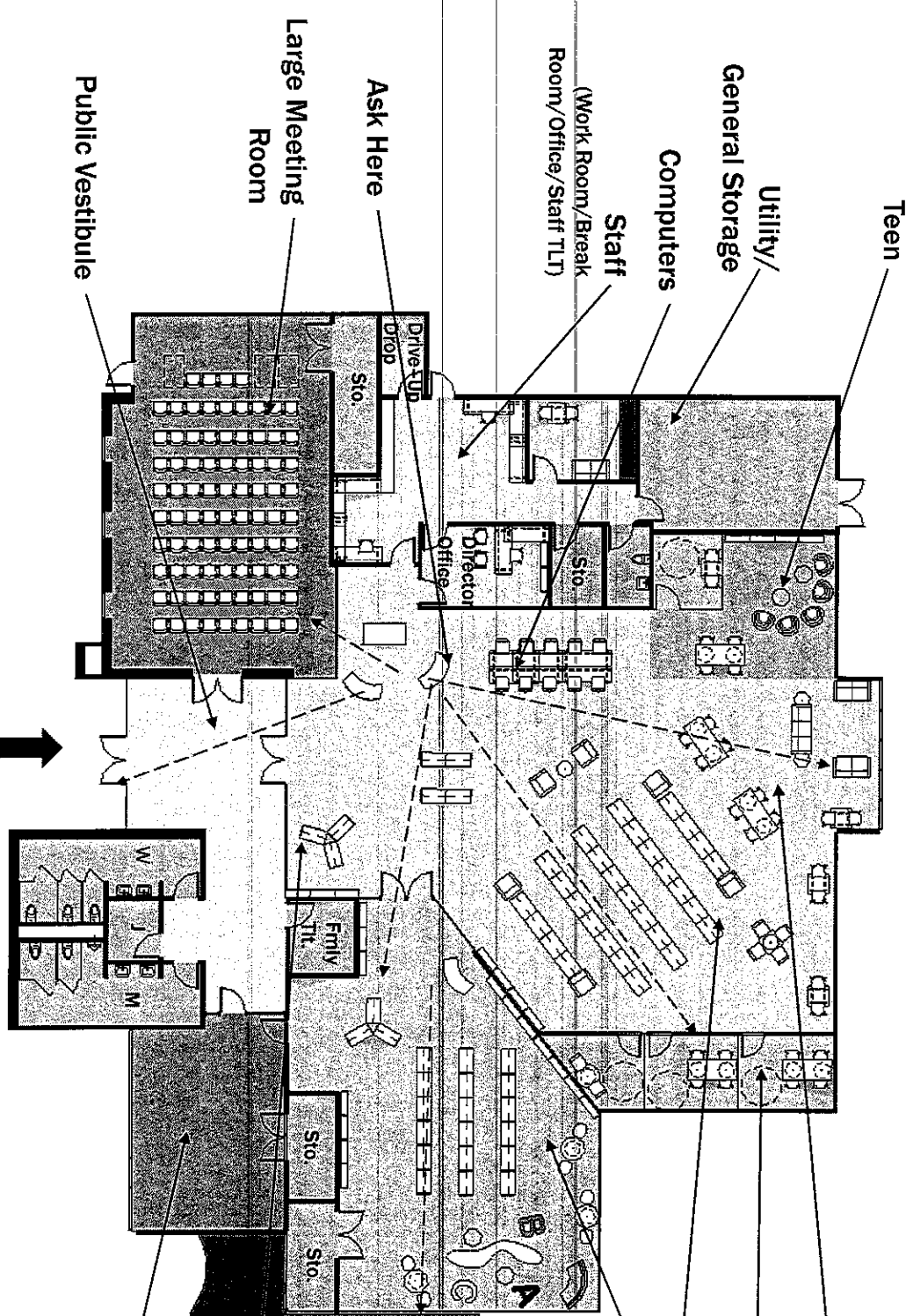
Rules

- Compete in either the team or solo competition.
- Planning and material preparation can be done before the competition, but construction beforehand is not allowed.
- Building of the libraries must be completed in the three-hour period.
- There are no limits to the amount or types of materials used to construct your library.
- The only limit is your imagination!
